She has already been called out on two separate occasions

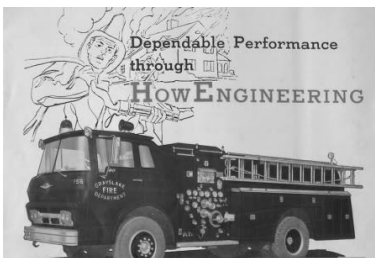
and provided support at the scene. Rev. Dr. Jane recently attended a conference on "Assisting Individuals in Crisis" in July for Fire Department Chaplains.

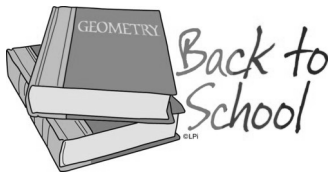

1 carton (16oz) frozen whipped topping, thawed

1 pkg (3.4 oz) instant pistachio pudding mix

6 to 7 drops green food coloring

3 cups mini marshmallows

1 can (20 oz) crushed

pineapple, undrained

1/2 cup chopped pistachios

Mix the whipped topping, pudding and food coloring in a large bowl. Fold in the marshmallows and pineapple. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hrs. Before serving top with pistachios.

Godly Play core training will be offered over three days in August at the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein: Friday, August 12, 4 pm to 9 pm; Saturday August 13, 8:30 am to 5:30 pm; and Sunday August 14, 8:30 am to 4 pm.

Training is sponsored by the Office of Lifelong Christian Formation in partnership with the Godly Play Foundation.

Godly Play teaches children the art of using Christian language—parable, sacred

story, silence and liturgical action—helping children become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence in their lives.

Godly Play is about locating each lesson in the whole system of Christian language and involving the creative process to discover the depths of meaning for individuals.

Godly Play is about learning how each of the stories of God's people connects with the child's own experience and relationship with God.

The goal of Godly Play is to show how to be open to the Holy Spirit, the Creator and the Redeemer all at once and all the time in every place.

Dinner will be served Friday night, and breakfast and lunch on Saturday and Sunday.
